house of the Lord for ever.

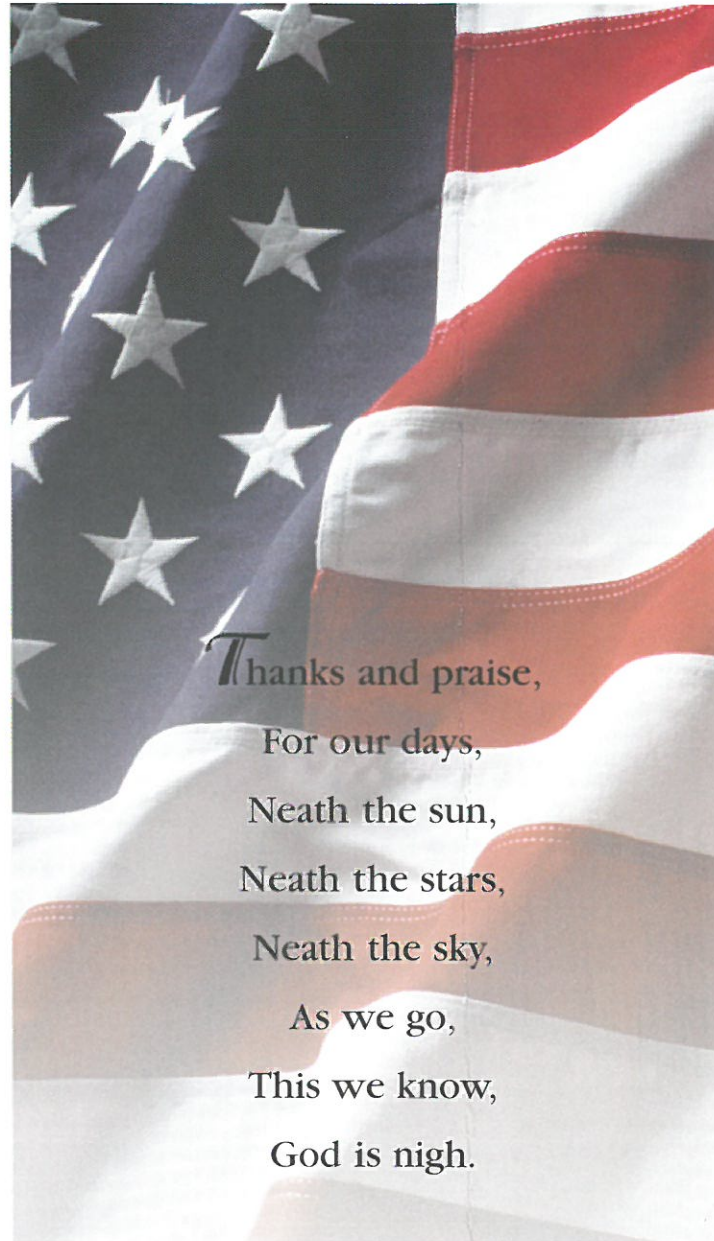

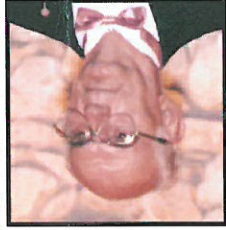
