Max was raised in Shenandoah where he attend school. Max graduated from high school with the Class of 1954. Following graduation Max enlisted in the United States Army. He leadeth me beside the still waters.

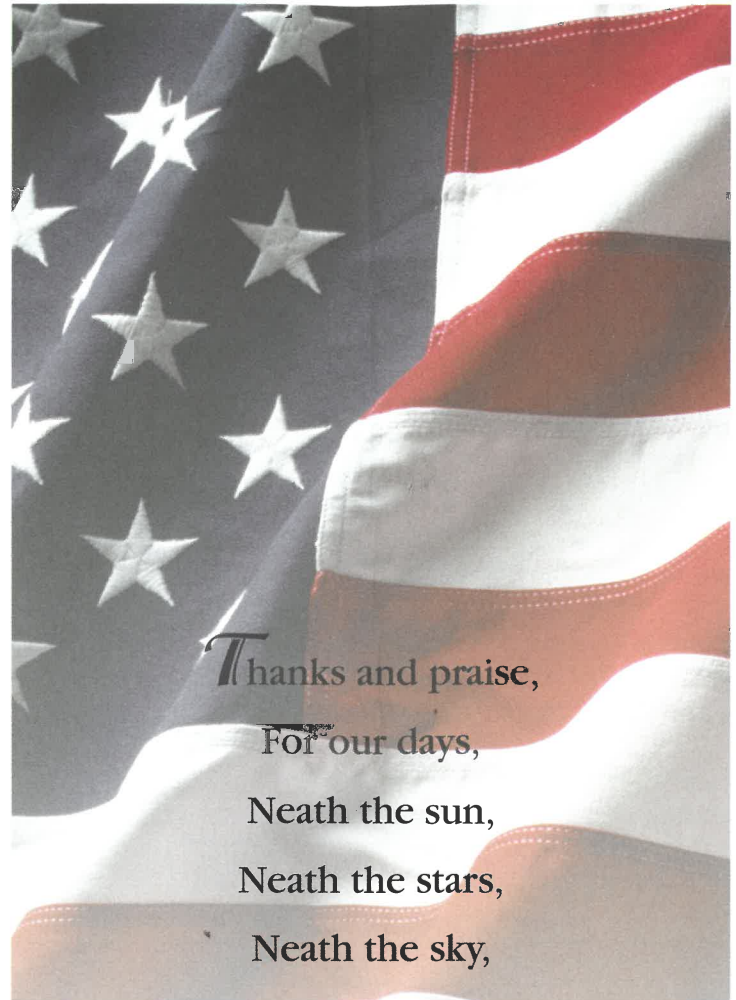
He restoreth my soul. He leadeth me in the
