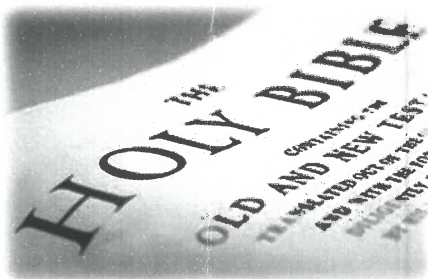


Anna Mae Martin 83, of Rockwell City, Iowa passed away Wednesday, March 5, 2014 at her home, following a short illness.
