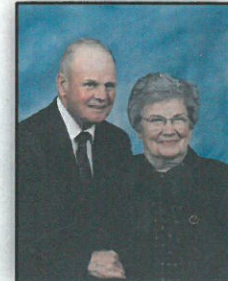

Known to most as Fran, she graduated from Hamburg High School and worked for a time in Omaha before her marriage to William W. Tyner at Summit United Methodist Church on March 17, 1946. Fran worked as a secretary at Mount Arbor Nurseries and then with Vern Fisher and, subsequently, with Larry Randolph.
