Curtis Lee Altizer, the son of Ralph M. and Belva L. (Winebarger) Altizer, was born October 18, 1946, in Bishop, Virginia, and passed away December 3, 2003, at this home in Shenandoah, Iowa.

As a young boy, Curt lived in Bishop until he was 9 years old. He moved with his family to Tazewell, Virginia, where he graduated from high school in 1964. After high school, he attended four years at Columbia Union College in Takoma Park, Maryland. Curt then enlisted into the U.S. Marine Corps, where he served his country for four years, with service in Vietnam, where he received the Purple Heart. On June 23, 1973, at the First United Methodist Church in Shenandoah, Virginia, Curt then married Susan Swigart, and to this union, Tricia and Todd were born.
