head with oil; my cup runneth over.

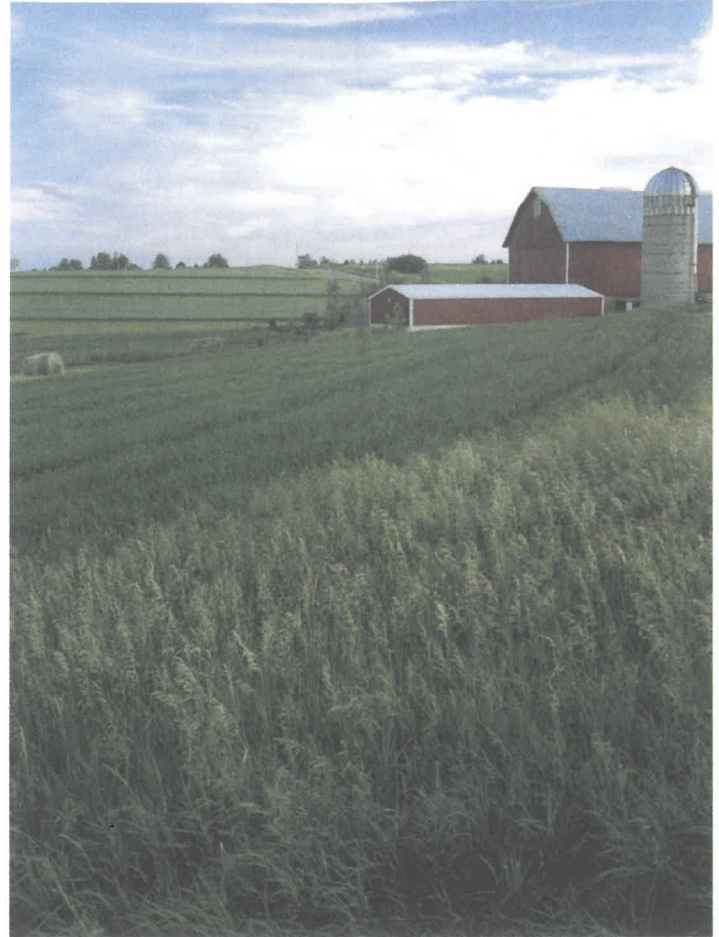
Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me
