How Great Thou Art

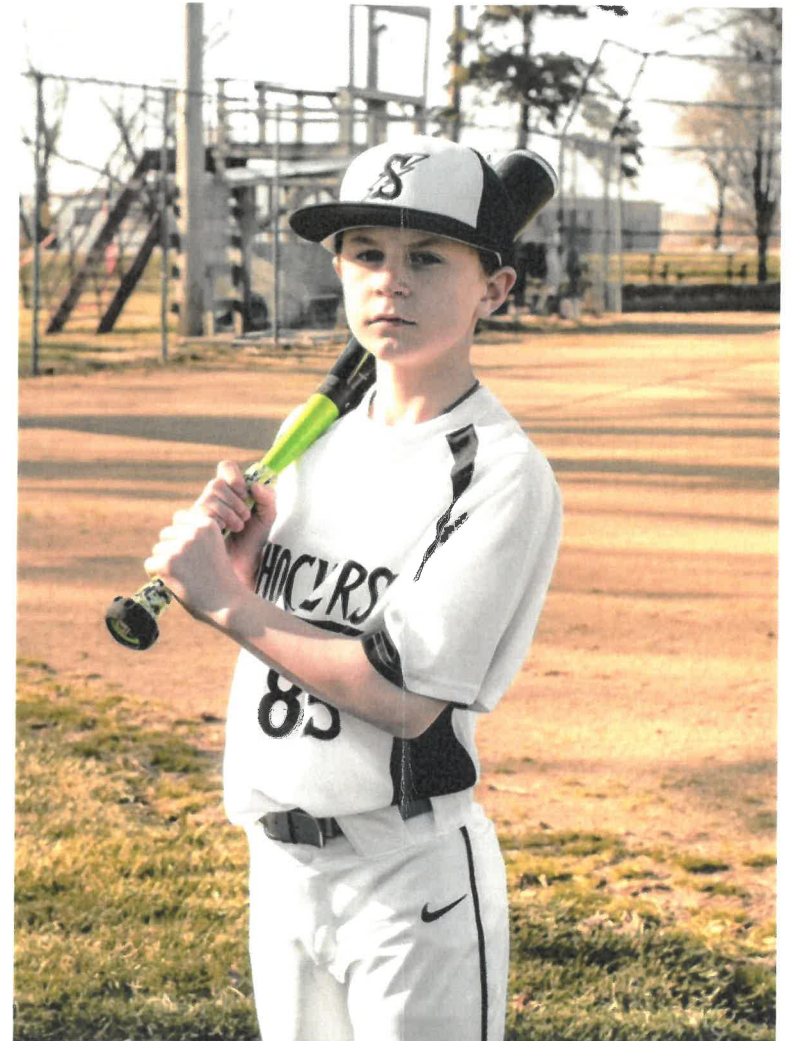
O Lord, my God, when I in awesome wonder
