## Merna F. Martin

Arna Faye Martin, age 89, the daughter of Royal A. and Elsie (Nelson) Brink, was born January 4, 1915, on the family farm south of Shenandoah, Iowa, and passed away February 18, 2004, at the Gardenview Care Center in Shenandoah.

Growing up the second oldest of 11 children, Merna could be relied upon to help raise the other children, do chores, drive the tractor, as well as find time to do the outdoor activities she so enjoyed. Her father instilled in her a love of sports, particularly baseball and tennis. In fact, her father, Roy, built a tennis court on their farm, where Merna and her sister, Shirley, and a host of friends and neighbors learned to master the game. Both men and women put that skill to the test in the Shenandoah City Tournament in 1937 where Merna walked away with the trophy.

Receiving her education in the Shenandoah school system, Merna graduated from high school in 1932, received Normal Training and taught school for a short time at Honeycreek country school.

On September 20, 1941, Merna was united in marriage to Charles D. Martin and together they raised six children, Rodney, Ed, Sandra, Sharon, Charlotte, and Darlene.

Following the death of her husband in 1958, Merna moved her family to Shenandoah. Her sense of humor and quick wit helped sustain her as she continued the job of raising her children alone. She was employed at Earl May Seed and Nursery Company for over 30 years, retiring at the age of 65. Her love of the outdoors continued, and often times she could be seen working in her yard and garden and tending to the flowers around the house. It seemed there was no task or job she wouldn't accomplish from refinishing furniture to constructing her driveway out of old red bricks.

Preceding Merna in death were her parents; husband, Charles, in 1958; youngest of her children, infant son, Gary Dean Martin; sister, Mildred Brink; and brothers, Dale, Willard, Boyd and Eldon Brink.
