Edna Bertha LeFever, the daughter of William E. and Fannie M. (Hutchinson), was born October 11, 1913, at Coin, Iowa, and passed away April 21, 2004, at the Grape Community Hospital in Hamburg, Iowa, at the age of 90.

Growing up in the Coin and College Spring, Iowa, area Edna received her education at a country school near Yorktown, Iowa. On August 19, 1942, she was united in marriage to Millard LeFever and to this union Linda and Marilyn were born.

Providing a home for her family and helping with the farm work was important to Edna. She was known for her great cooking, using lots of cream and frying just about everything. She didn't watch much TV, but she regularly watched *The Bold and the Beautiful* and the *Dr. Phil Show*. Her favorite newspaper cartoon was *Dennis the Menace*. Edna liked just about everyone, had a great sense of humor and enjoyed teasing. Her daughters remembered driving home with their mother from Farragut once when she was distracted, drove into the ditch in front of the Farragut Cemetery, gathered some spirea on the hood ornament, drove out of the ditch and continued home without stopping. She just smiled.

Edna was always concerned and worrying about her family as they were the most important thing in her life. She so loved her grandchildren. In 1979 she moved into the Holmes apartments where she lived until going into the hospital in March. Edna was a lady who lived and died with dignity.

Preceding Edna in death were her parents; husband, Millard LeFever; brothers, Clay, Clarence and Raymond McNutt.; and sisters, Hazel Forbes and Sadie McNutt.
