Ethel L. Cook

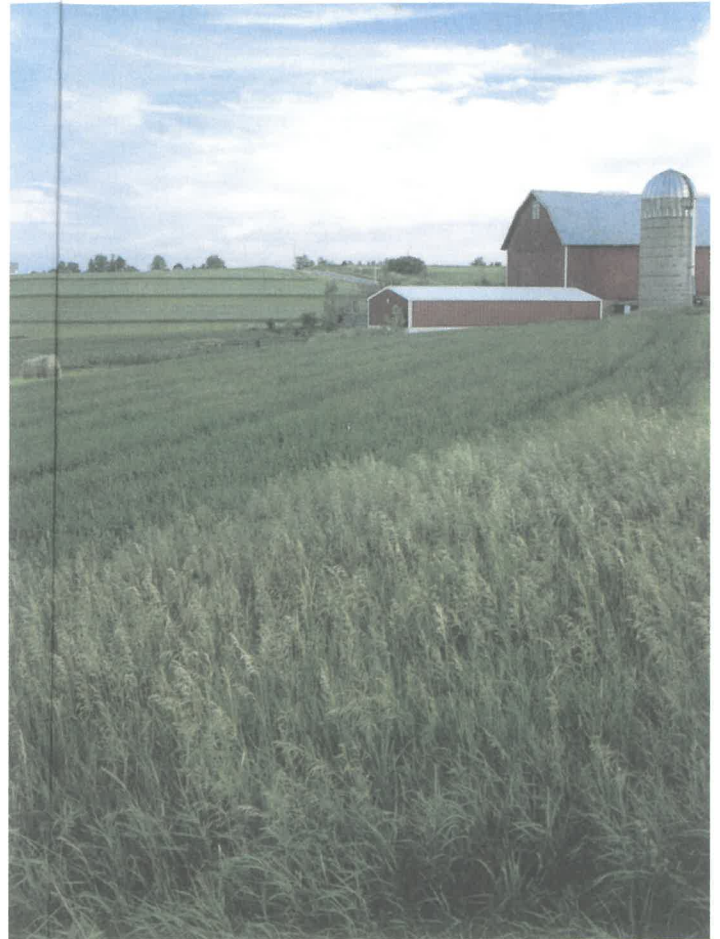
