

Steven Ralph Putnam, son of Jack Eugene and Mary Lucille (Broughton) Putnam, was born on November 13, 1955, in Shenandoah, Iowa. Steve entered into eternal rest on Wednesday, August 31, 2022, at the Shenandoah Medical Center, in Shenandoah at the age of 66 years, 9 months, 18 days.

His early life was spent growing up in Shenandoah where he attended the Shenandoah Community Schools graduating from Shenandoah High School with the Class of 1974.

Following graduation, Steve began working for Eaton Corporation in 1974 and retired in 2015, giving 41 years of service to Eaton's.
