Cecilia Marie McEnaney, daughter of William and Anna (Larkin) Broxterman, was born on January 9, 1911, in Baileyville, Kansas. She passed away on Tuesday, April 16, 2002, at Garden View Care Center in Shenandoah at the age of 91. Cecilia grew up in Kansas and received her education there.
