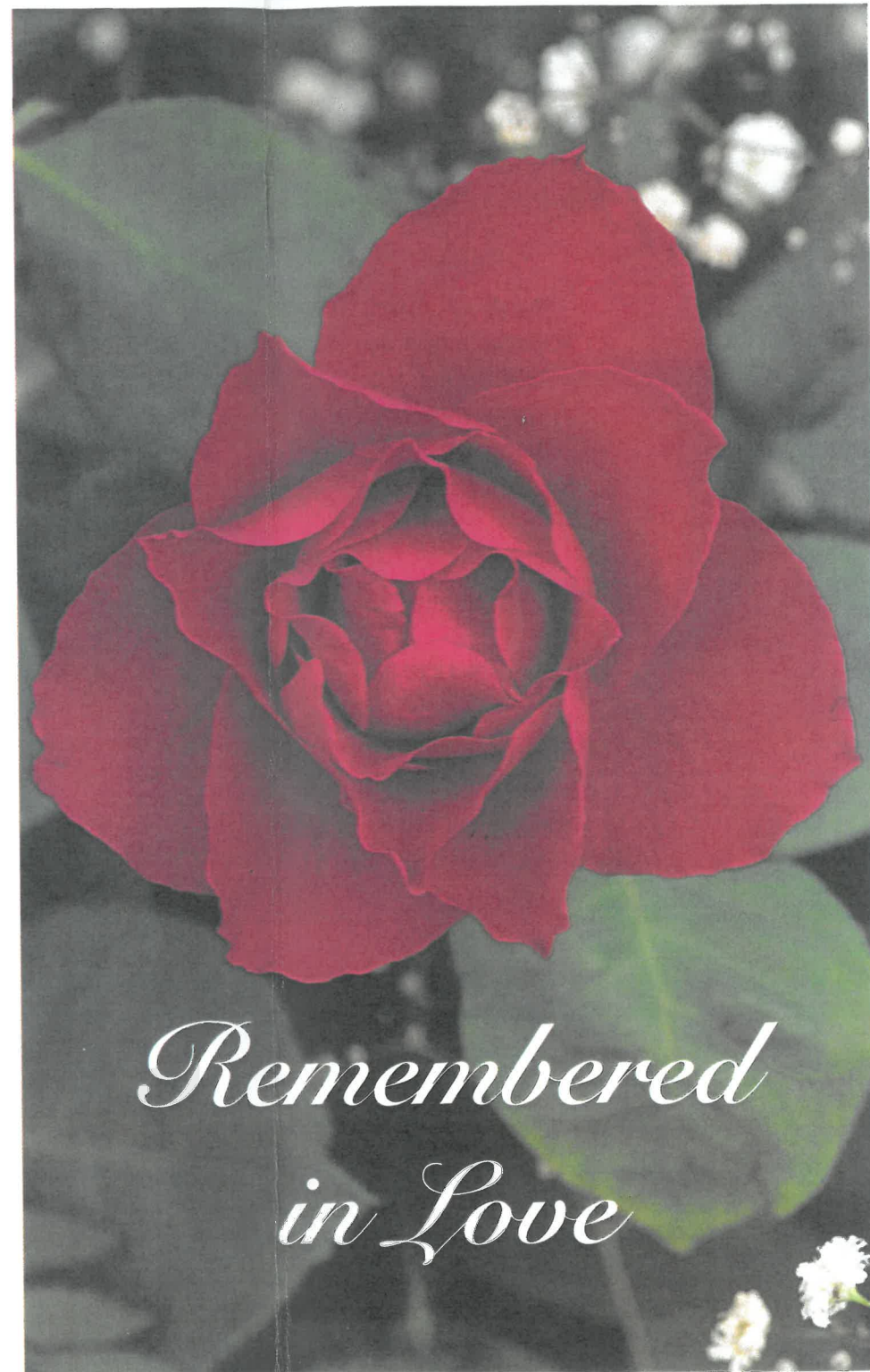
Memories in the Heart
