

Rex Whitehill

Rex Gaylord Whitehill, age 75, the son of Samuel J. and Lola B. (Robirds) Whitehill, was born May 2, 1929, in Shenandoah, Iowa, and passed away December 17, 2004, in Omaha, Nebraska.

Growing up in Shenandoah, Rex ("Hap" as he was called in school) graduated from Shenandoah High School in 1947, where he participated in basketball and football and later at the college level. He attended the University of Indiana from 1947 to 1948 and then attended and graduated from Tarkio College with a B.S. Degree in 1951. Rex also advanced his studies at the Chicago Institute of Technology.

On March 19, 1948, in Omaha, Nebraska, Rex was united in marriage to his high school sweetheart, Aldean "Deanie" Brown, and to this union, Deanna, Todd, and Tami were born. After their marriage, they lived in Shenandoah, where Rex was employed as traffic manager for Henry Field Seed and Nursery Company from 1950 to 1952. He then served through 1954 in the U.S. Army with duty in Korea and with separation as Staff Sergeant. During his service he received various citation metals and ribbons including the Commendation Ribbon with Metal Pendant and Bronze Star.

Returning to Shenandoah Rex was associated with Farmaster Products Company for 18 years serving as Vice President and General Manager and four years on the board of directors of Wickes Corporation. He then served as Executive Vice president for Mount Arbor Nursery for seven years until 1982. Rex and his family then moved to McPherson, Kansas, where he was employed as plant manager for Femco Corporation, retiring in 1994.

Rex was a 60 year member of the First Christian Church serving on various committees including CYF sponsor and Chairman of the Board of Directors. He was a member of the Shenandoah Booster Club where he accomplished some major projects while serving as President. He had been a member of Shenandoah Chamber of Commerce, Shenandoah Industrial Board, Rotary International where he served as President and District Governor's Representative. He also was a member of Toastmasters International, Director of West Page County Red Cross, Drive Chairman for United Way, Advisory Board of Area XIII Vocational School, member of the American Legion for 46 years and also a member of the VFW and Life member of Disabled American Veterans. While living in McPherson, Kansas, Rex was active in the chamber of commerce serving on the McPherson Airport Improvement Committee. He was appointed by Kansas Governor Carlin to serve on the Kansas Calvary for encouraging industries, both national and international levels to relocate to Kansas.

Preceding Rex in death were his parents and sister, Aldyce O'Donnell.

Rex ("Poppie" as his grandchildren called him) is survived by his wife, Deanie, of Shenandoah; children, Deanna L Lutz and husband, James, of Overland Park, Kansas, Todd Whitehill of McPherson, Kansas and Tami Keasling of Lawrence, Kansas. Also surviving is a sister, Colleen Judy, of Chicago, Illinois; 10 grandchildren, Callie and Bre Farnum, Drew Whitehill and his wife, Amber, Evan and Alex Whitehill, Logan and Regan Keasling, Gina, Peter and Joey Lutz; and one great granddaughter, Lanie Whitehill; other relatives and many friends.
