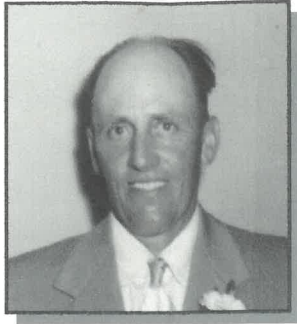

Ray Linquist

Ray Franklin Anderson Linquist, the son of Frank and Ellen (Anderson) Linquist, was born March 22, 1915, in Nyman, Iowa, and passed away February 10, 2001, in Mesa, Arizona.

Ray grew up in the Nyman area receiving his education in Nyman Country School and the Essex school system. On November 22, 1932, he was united in marriage to Ethel Colwell at Plattesmouth, Nebraska, and to this union, Glatis, Frank, Gaile and Jack were born. As a young man, Ray worked as a trucker and then farmed in the Nyman area and later near Coin, Iowa. Ray and Ethel then moved to Aurora, Colorado, where Ray worked as a maintenance supervisor for the Aurora Water Department for 17 years. After retiring in 1978, Ray and Ethel moved back to the Shenandoah area to live. Ray was a former member of Fremont Lutheran Church in Nyman; Loyal Order of Moose, Lodge #1824 in Aurora, where he had served as Governor; Eagles Lodge in Aurora, Council Bluffs, Iowa, and later in Shenandoah. He also was a member of Shenandoah Elks Lodge #1122.

Ray loved to travel in their motor home and take photos with his camcorder. He loved woodworking and making various craft items.

Preceding Ray in death were his parents; son, Frank Linquist; sisters, Fern Nelson and Beulah Thompson; and brother, Orville Linquist.

Survivors include his wife, Ethel Linquist of Shenandoah; daughters, Glatis Hoffman and husband, Lloyd, of Aurora, Colorado and Gaile Bachand and husband, Jim, of Colorado Springs, Colorado; son, Jack Linquist and wife, Margaret, of Shenandoah; twenty-eight grandchildren; fifty-two great-grandchildren; and nineteen great-great grandchildren.
