Doris Madeline Perry, daughter of Lewis Lloyd and Vesta Regina (Walker) Reed, was born on October 27, 1922 in Braddyville, Iowa. She passed away on Monday, August 27, 2018 at the Legacy Gardens Special Memory Care in Iowa City, Iowa at the age of 95.

Doris was born on a farm between Braddyville and College Springs, the family then moved when she was a young child to a farm just north of Braddyville. She attended grade school through high school in Braddyville. She graduated from Braddyville High School in 1940 with 12 students in her class. She attended Northwest Missouri State Teacher's College in Maryville, MO for two years where she earned her teaching certificate. Doris also attended fashion design school for nine months in Chicago, IL in the mid-1940s, she was especially interested in the tailoring aspect of design.
