Obituary

Don Stanley Amos, son of Donald Dwight and Esther Elisa Ingals Amos, was born on September 25, 1934, in Cedar Falls, Iowa. Snug attended the Shenandoah Community Schools graduating from the Shenandoah High School Class of 1952. Following graduation he worked as a lifeguard and for Economy Products. He joined the United States Army in August of 1958. He spent 17 years overseas. Ten years were spent in Southeast Asia during the Vietnam War as an intelligent operations sergeant. Snug retired as a Master Sergeant in 1981. During his service years he was awarded the Bronze Star with two Oak Leaf Clusters, the Good Conduct Medal, Army Commendation Medal, and many other honors. Following his retirement he returned to Shenandoah to make his home. He worked during the winter months, part time for ITI, packaging cleaning products, and in the summers at the American Legion Country Club on the golf course. He was a member of the Shenandoah American Legion Post #88 and the Shenandoah Elks Lodge #1122.

Don was preceded in death by his parents. He is survived by his faithful dog Max, his cousin Don Baxter of Loveland, Colorado, other relatives, special friend Jim Blane and many other friends.
