Growing up in Shenandoah, Bryce received his education from the Shenandoah school system. He also attended and graduated from Iowa Western Community College in Council Bluffs, Iowa.

Bryce enlisted into the U.S. Army and served between 1948 and 1950 and then was drafted in 1952 to serve during the Korean Conflict.
