Gerald Dean Mattes, age 87, the son of Alfred and Pearl (Cheney) Mattes was born September 13, 1916, in rural Missouri, southwest of Hamburg, Iowa, and passed away February 11, 2004, in Clarinda, Iowa.

At the age of 6 months, Gerald and his family moved to a farm in the Locust Grove community. He attended Fairview Country School through the 8th grade and then high school in Farragut, Iowa. As a young man he continued working for several years on the home farm plus doing custom work for other farmers.

On August 20, 1943, Gerald was united in marriage to Norma Nicks and to this union, Stephen, Joyce, Sheryl and Rex was born. On August 20, 2003, they celebrated their 60th wedding anniversary.

After their marriage Gerald and Norma farmed southeast of Farragut in the Locust Grove area and also southeast of Riverton, Iowa. In 1952 they moved to a farm north of Braddyville, Iowa, and in 1954 to a farm northeast of Elmo, Missouri, where they continued their farming operation for 40 years into the 1990s. During those years, Gerald also did custom bulldozing, spraying, and combining. Farming was his life. He enjoyed working with bulldozers, trucking for others and raising livestock and grain. Retiring in 1995 they moved to Farragut.


