Lois Eugenia Ohnmacht, the daughter of Silas E. and Bertha E. (Laurence) Fisher, was born October 24, 1904, on a cold frosty morning near Humbolt, Nebraska, and passed away July 19, 2004, on a warm and humid morning in Clarinda, Iowa, at the age of 99.

The fourth of eighth children, Lois moved with her family to south of Peru, Nebraska, when she was one year old. There she attended rural school through the eighth grade. Lois graduated from the T.J. Majors High School in 1923 and later obtained an A.B. Degree from Peru State Teachers College. The following years she taught in Mason City, Wells, Silver Creek and near Nebraska City, Nebraska.

In December 1936, Lois was united in marriage to George John Ohnmacht and to this union, a son, Dennis was born. They lived four years on a farm near Peru before moving in 1940 near Northboro, Iowa, where George, his parents and brothers each bought farm land.
