John Franklin Hargan, the son of Mervin and Lydia (Walter) Hargan, was born January 14, 1921, in Corning, Iowa and passed away June 12, 2001, in Omaha, Nebraska.

John received his elementary education in country schools in Taylor and Adam counties and graduated from Corning High School. During his early years, John worked at Consolidated Aircraft Company in San Diego, California. When World War II broke out, he entered the U.S. Navy at Corning, Iowa, on October 28, 1943, serving stateside in Naval Air Units until his discharge on May 6, 1946. John farmed with his father for one year and then for the rest of his working career, worked for farm equipment dealers in sales and service in Illinois and Iowa.

On October 10, 1975, in Omaha, Nebraska, John was united in marriage to Helen Hinsley. He was baptized at the Faith Lutheran Church in Watseka, Illinois and was a 50 year member of the American Legion Post #88.

Preceding John in death were his parents and one sister, Clara Jane Hargan.
