
Thank you Dad for all the times, you were there to care.

Arthur Thomas "Tom" Brodersen, son of Arthur August and Maude Elizabeth (Thomas) Brodersen, was born on October 8, 1934, in Florence, Missouri. He was called home on Tuesday morning, January 17, 2023, at the Shenandoah Medical Center at the age of 88 years, 3 months, 9 days.

Tom grew up on a farm in central Missouri with one brother and three sisters. After graduating from Otterville High School in 1952, he worked various jobs - truck driver,

bookmobile driver and carpenter – until a cousin from Shenandoah, Iowa, offered him an apprenticeship in his barbershop if Tom would attend barber college in Des Moines. In 1957, Tom moved to Shenandoah to barber, but

he was drafted into the United States Army. He served two years, with majority of his time spent in Germany.

In 1960, Tom married Doris Savage. They have two sons: Steve and his wife, Dawn, live in Lexington, Kentucky, and Bob and his wife, Beth, live in





Adel, Iowa. Tom and Doris have three grandsons, Nick (Eva), Sam, and Phillip

Brodersen, and granddaughter, Sela Brodersen.

In earlier years, Tom was a Jaycees Club member and later, the Rotary Club and Elks. While his boys were growing up he supported them by participating in Boy Scout high adventure trips to Colorado and the boundary waters of Minnesota and many other camping and fundraising events. He enjoyed camping with his family at Lake of Three Fires, Viking Lake and other areas.



In 1968, Tom purchased the barber/beauty shop from Dennis Boldra. The shop was a gathering place for many with lots of stories, banter and commentary of the day. Many stopped by just to contribute and share a cup of coffee.

After 53 years of service to the public, he retired from barbering in 2010. He and his wife, Doris, were honored

as Grand Marshals of the Fall ShenFest Parade that same year. After retirement, Tom continued to be active. He contributed his time and talents to the Shenandoah Historical Museum, loved driving the old fire truck in parades and was a part-time employee of Nishna Valley Funeral and Cremation Service.



Tom enjoyed doing his own home projects and was quite the carpenter and handyman. He followed school sports, played a boring game of golf (by hitting consistently straight), and was active in the Presbyterian Church.
