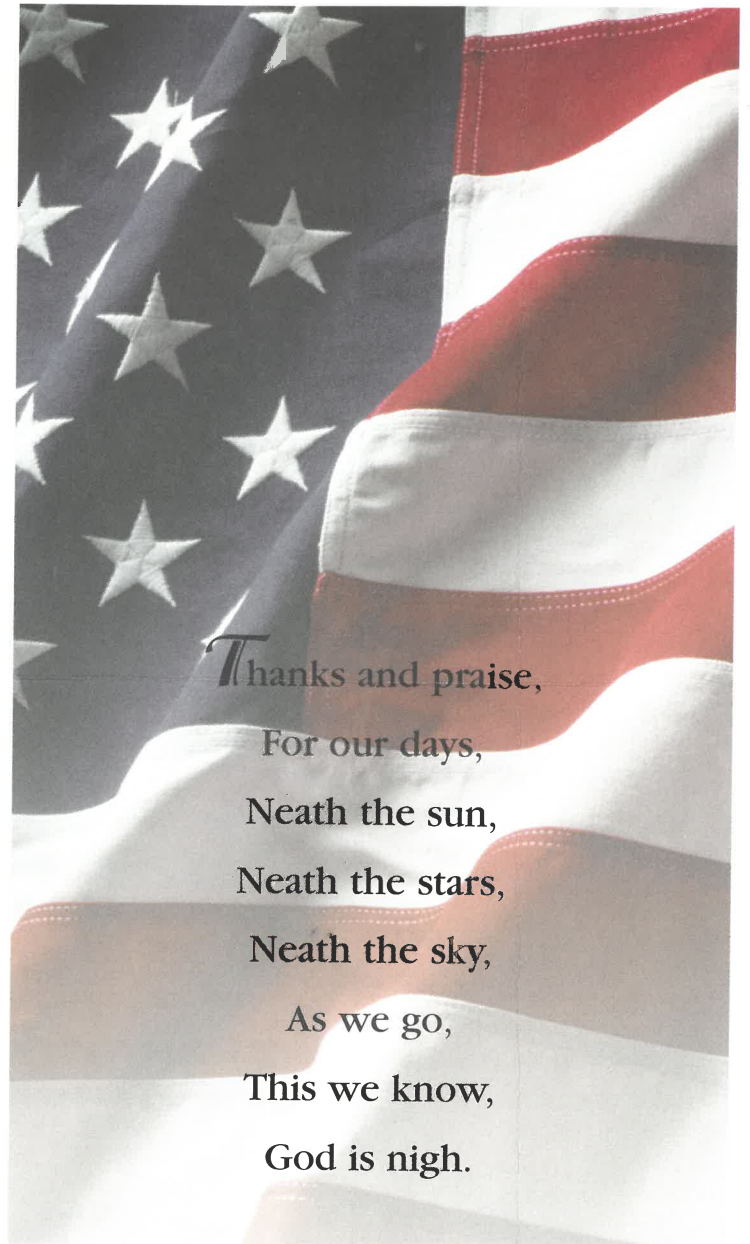
Rhonda was preceded in death by her grandparents Alvin and Maxine Hall and Raymond and Berniece Houston.
