Gladys Irene Teachout, the daughter of Benjamin F. and Estella M. (Agnew) Kendall, was born April 17, 1902 on a farm near Morrocco, Indiana and departed this life December 23, 1999 in Kansas City, Missouri, at the age of 97 years.

The first two years of Gladys' life was spent on the farm where she was born and the next five years on a farm near Mason City, IL. At the age of seven, she moved to the Shenandoah, IA area. She spent much of her life on the Teachout family farm until January 1963 when she moved into Shenandoah. In July of 1998, she moved to the Regency Care Center in Independence, MO.

Gladys received her education in the Shenandoah school system, graduating in 1920. While in high school, she took normal training to be a teacher. She taught in Page county rural schools for five years: 4 years at White Cloud and 1 year at Fairview.

On September 2, 1925, Gladys married George D. Teachout and moved to the family farm. To this union, 6 children were born, Georgene, Ardyth, Robert, Donald, Della and Karen. She worked hard though the years, not only being involved with the farming operation, but for about 40 years, raising the well known Teachout turkeys. They started with 18 poults and increased to about 20,000 birds per year. Gladys loved flower gardening and nature, especially birds, but the enjoyment of her family always came first.

Gladys was a member of the First United Methodist Church, United Methodist Women, Altrusa International, American Legion Auxilliary, Nautilus Club, S&S Homemakers Club, was an Iowa Master Farm Homemaker, and served many years as a Walnut Ever Ready Girls 4-H Club leader in Fremont County.

Preceding Gladys in death were her parents; her beloved husband, George, in 1960; granddaughter, Linda Stinnett; four brothers; and three sisters.

Survivors include her children, Georgene Stinnett, and Ardyth Mercer, both of Kansas City, MO, Robert Teachout of North Kansas City, MO, Donald Teachout and his wife, Barbara, and Della Staples and her husband, Bill, all of Shenandoah, and Karen Van Trump and her husband, Arnold of Kansas City, MO; 13 grandchildren; 22 great-grandchildren; and four great-great-grandchildren.
