William "Ez" Albert Lauber, the son of George and Lula (Gregory) Lauber, was born October 27, 1917, in St. Joseph, Missouri, and passed away June 30, 2002, at the Shenandoah Memorial Hospital in Shenandoah, Iowa.

Ez grew up in Maryville, Missouri until he was ten years old and then moved with his family to Shenandoah. He then received his education in the Shenandoah school system, graduating in 1935. After high school Ez attended Chillicothe Business School in Missouri for two years. On December 25, 1941, in Rock Port, Missouri, Ez was united in marriage to Leola (Bennie) Benware. He joined the Army Air Force in September of 1941, being part of the first group of Army Air Force to go from Shenandoah. He was discharged on October 5, 1945 in Sioux City, Iowa.

After serving his country, Ez worked for the U.S. Postal Service for thirty-three years before retiring in 1972. Following retirement from the Post Office he was employed at Kitchen Klatter for several years. He was a member of the American Legion Post #88 of Shenandoah and the United Methodist Church.
