John L. Davey, son of Leonard and F (Campbell) Davey, was born in Shenandoah, Iowa on October 3, 1916. He passed away at Fair Oaks in Shenandoah on April 30, 2004. John was united in marriage to Mary Ann Maher on September 14, 1947 in Imogene, Iowa. Later in life, John married Genevieve (Wright) LeFever on October 20, 1989 in Independence, Missouri.

John was a lifelong resident of the Page County area, living in town and on the farm. He attended Shenandoah High School and John enlisted in the army in December of 1939 and was honorably discharged in August of 1945. During those six years he served as a Rank Staff Sergeant of Company E 168th Infantry Regiment European African Campaign. He was awarded three bronze medals and was a POW for twenty-seven months. John held several positions in Shenandoah including Davey Trucking, mechanic Miller Tractor, Thermogas, and Davey Skelly Service Station owner until he retired in 1979.

John was a member of the Presbyterian and St. Mary's Catholic Church. He served on the St. Mary's Church Council, VFW Commander, and the American Legion. John was also an active member of the local school PTA, the Chamber of Commerce, the Elks Club, the ELKS, and the Shenandoah Armory Board.

John was preceded in death by his father, Leonard Davey; mother, Hazel Davey; first wife, Arlene Davey; and grandson, Michael Davey. Survivors include wife, Genevieve Davey; sons, Fred Davey and wife Patti of Naperville, Illinois; and James Davey and wife Eileen of Shenandoah, Iowa; brother, Glen Davey of Shenandoah, Iowa; sisters, Wilma Turner of St. Louis, Missouri and Hazel Waldron of Shenandoah; grandchildren, Brad (19) and (18) Davey of Naperville, Illinois, Kevin (23) and Brian (18) Westminister, Colorado, and Lauren (17) of Shenandoah and other relatives and many friends.
