## Kimber A. Gilbert

Kimber Alephious Gilbert, the son of Levi and Vena (Conkin) Gilbert, was born December 15, 1911, in Riverton, IA, and passed away June 17, 2000, in Shenandoah, IA, at the age of 88 years.

Kimber attended school in Riverton through the 4<sup>th</sup> grade and then attended rural Fareview country school, which was located just south of Shenandoah. He graduated from Shenandoah High School in 1932. He was united in marriage to Aletha M. Plautz on May 19, 1938, in Fremont, NE, and to this union, Lavonne and Larry were born. At the early part of his working career, Kimber hauled equipment from Omaha to Shenandoah for the Sondag Implement Company; worked for the Iowa State Highway Department, mowing roadsides; and worked for Earl May and Henry Field before starting his own trucking business in 1936. Kimber was in the trucking business for 56 years. After retiring from his own business he then worked for the Koch Ag Service in Shenandoah for two years until 1993.
