Alton W. "Bud" Joyce

Alton Walker "Bud" Joyce, the son of Walker P. and Bertha M. (Woods) Joyce was born March 28, 1918, in Coal, MO, and passed away August 6, 2001, in Shenandoah, Iowa.

It was at Good Hope Baptist Church that Bud was saved and baptized in Pretty Bob Creek. As a boy he spend most of his time around his dad's blacksmith shop. He went through the 8th grade in a one-room schoolhouse and with one teacher. Coal only had a two-year high school so Bud drove himself and two other boys to Clinton High School for their last two years, graduating in 1935.

Bud enjoyed being part of the traveling basketball team in high school and also belonging to the Hi-Y Boy's Club. After graduating from high school he got his official referee basketball license and recalled playing Friday afternoons on outdoor dirt courts. He also drove a school bus after graduating from high school. Bud was also a substitute on the rural mail route driving a Model T Ford and later received a temporary appointment to deliver mail on a regular schedule for one year. The mail route helped him buy his first new car in 1938.

On May 7, 1941, Bud volunteered to serve in the Army Air Corp and spent four years in the service making the rank of Master Sergeant. After a blind date with a girl named Marjorie Little and after several months of dating, they were married on November 24, 1946. To this union, three children, Pam, Jane and Robert were born. In July of 1948, Bud went to work for L.J. Messer Company in Lincoln, NE and shortly afterwards moved to Beatrice, NE to work at their store until 1957. Bud then went into business with his brother, Wayne in Red Oak, IA opening the Joyce Bros. Auto Supply Company. In 1958, they moved to Shenandoah to open their store. Later they opened stores in Clarinda, Griswold and Hamburg. Bud retired in December 1986, after selling the stores. After retirement, Bud and Marjorie moved to Fairfield Bay, AK where they lived for 10 years returning to Shenandoah in 1998.

Preceding Bud in death were his parents and a son Robert in 1968. Survivors include his wife, Marjorie, of Shenandoah; two daughters, Pam Revell and her husband, Bob, of St. Joseph, MO and Jane Willard and her husband, John, of Shenandoah. Also surviving are 6 grandchildren, Mark Revell and wife, Jodi of Omaha, NE, Salena Hirschbrunner and husband, Jeff, of Lincoln, NE, Abby Revell of St. Joseph, and Preslie, John and Mike Willard of Shenandoah. Other survivors include one great grandson, Jonah Walker Revell of Omaha, plus a brother, Wayne Joyce and wife, Elnora, of Red Oak and a sister, Lois Sherman of Carrollton, MO plus other relatives and many friends.
