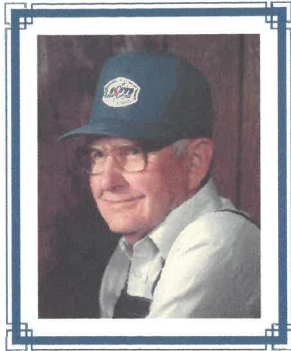

Paul Gibson Scott, the son of Harvey and Cora (Ross) Scott, was born August 12, 1909, on a farm north of Farragut, Iowa, and passed away on December 8, 2003, in Shenandoah, Iowa.

As a young boy, Paul attended country school, which he accidentally burnt down. His grandfather had an empty house, so school continued there. He graduated from Shenandoah High School in 1927 and then began his life long career of farming. On December 26, 1928, Paul was united in marriage to Ruth Sheirbon, and to this union, Evelyn and Kay were born. They celebrated their 72nd wedding anniversary as they moved into Gardenview Care Center.

After their marriage, Paul and Ruth lived and farmed north of Farragut for many years. Paul also took over farming his grandfather's farm, which later was recognized as a Century Farm. They raised grain crops, fed cattle and hogs and raised seed corn for Earl May and DeKalb. After retiring in 1974, they purchased an acreage four miles south of Shenandoah on highway 59. In 1979, a tornado hit their place and they had to rebuild and start over again.

Paul enjoyed woodcarving, fishing in Minnesota, moose hunting in Canada, and flying his single engine plane. For 18 years, he and Ruth spent winters in McAllen, Texas, traveled throughout the United States, went on a cruise, traveled to Hawaii, to the Marti Gras in New Orleans, and at the age of 80, went white water rafting in Colorado.

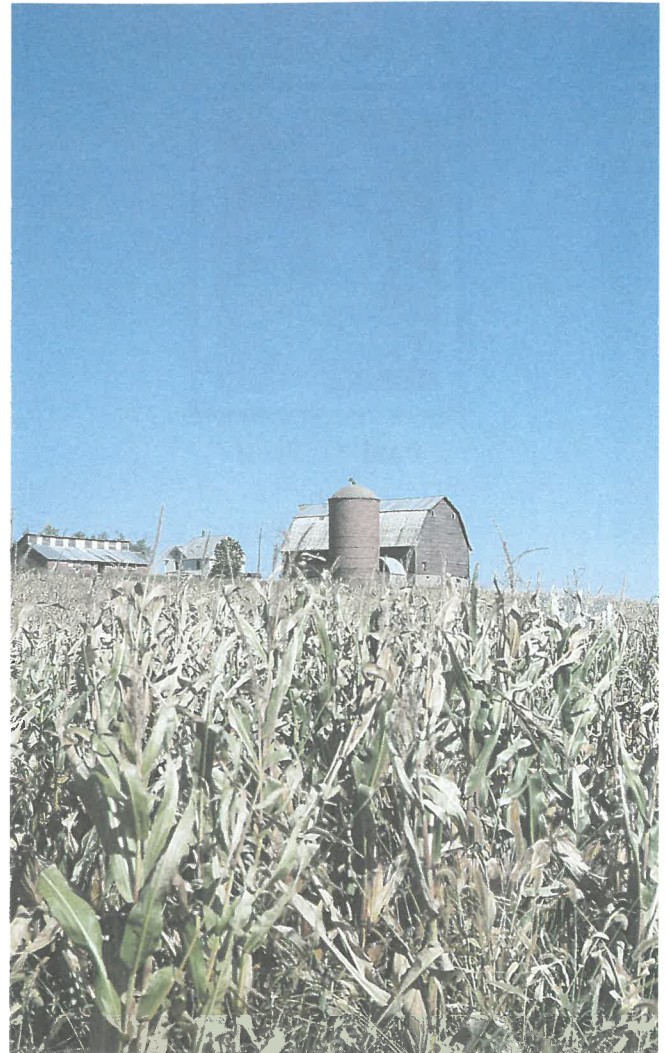
Paul attended the Dale Carnegie course, was a member of the Lions Club and the United Methodist Church in Shenandoah. He's remembered for his great sense of humor, how he enjoyed people and their visits, and particularly, all who cared for him at Gardenview Care Center.

Preceding Paul in death were his parents; wife, Ruth, on February 5, 2001; and his two brothers, Ward and Dale Scott.

Survivors include Paul's daughters and sons-in-law, Evelyn and Glendon Lindburg of Shenandoah and Kay and Ed Neil of Omaha, Nebraska; grandchildren and their spouses, Teena and Tom Hohl of Aurora, Colorado, and Jay and Shari Lindburg of Shenandoah.
