
Michael D. Davey 1976 - 2000

Michael Damian Davey, son of James L. and Elizabeth Eileen (Tray) Davey, was born on June 19, 1976, in Red Oak, Iowa, and passed away on June 26, 2000, from injuries resulting from a car accident in Richfield, Utah. He was 24 years of age. He spent the first three years of his life in Shenandoah and then lived in Omaha, Nebraska, Douglas, Wyoming, and Spring, Texas, before moving back to Shenandoah with his parents in 1993. Michael attended Shenandoah High School graduating with honors with the Class of 1994. He attended the University of Iowa for two years.
