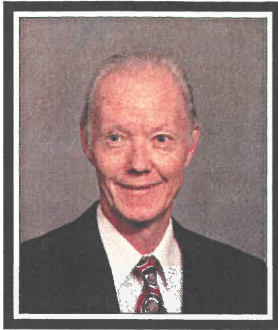

Duaine Clayton Boyer, the son of Bernard C. and Irene R. (Youngberg) Boyer, was born July 24, 1941, in Los Angeles, CA, and passed away February 2, 2004, in Escondido, CA.

For the first few years of his life, Duaine lived with his family in Los Angeles, where his dad worked in the ship yards during WWII. They then moved back to Iowa where he grew up on a farm and later moving to Shenandoah, IA, where he graduated from high school in 1960. In 1962 he graduated from trade school in Milford, NE. He was a member of the Emmanuel Lutheran Church.

On August 4, 1963, Duaine was united in marriage to Irma Hall in Shenandoah and to this union; Jody Ann and Julie Anna were born. They soon moved to Rolla, Missouri where Duaine worked for the area telephone company. It was here that they all worked together to build a house, even Jody and Julie assisted. A move to Maryville, MO, made it possible to be closer to Duaine's parents, as his dad was ill. Later Duaine moved with his family to Jefferson City, MO, where he worked as an engineer with the telephone company. He was very involved with the Lutheran Church as an Elder and also spent time volunteering at a home for boys.

As his children grew up, life changed for Duaine, and he moved to Anchorage, AK, where he continued his career as an engineer for the telephone company. Within a few years he began traveling the world, contracting himself out as one of the best engineers in the world of telecommunications. He was respected in his field as he had worked himself up through his career without a degree. He was sought after in his field and worked in several locations throughout the world, including Saudi Arabia, Dallas, TX, Atlanta, GA, Kansas City, MO, and San Diego, CA.

Duaine was a man who loved his family. He was a son who accomplished much in the way of love and duty to his parents as well as to his children and grandchildren. His accomplishments and dreams are of a man who was wealthy in love and experience.

In 2001, he moved to southern California where he married Doris Mantry on June 24, 2001. She was a cherished companion to him.
